On Dec. 19th, 2023, Nicolle wrote the following on Facebook:

"In 2016, we had our very first Love Box TM delivery. Our goal was to gift 100 children with a Love Box TM at Sophia's satellite hospital, which was Centenary Hospital. We reached out to friends and family and were able to collect over 1,000 boxes!

Fast forward to today, December 19th, 2023, our total of Love Boxes TM gifted is 40,000!

How did we do this? LOVE. Pure love and goodness from so many people's hearts!

My daughter, Sophia, had cancer when she was just 2 years old. We spent Christmas in the hospital getting treatment. My husband was then diagnosed with Stage 4 cancer and passed away in September 2019. That Christmas was the worst. So yes, the holidays are a magical and happy time but they are also filled with sadness for so many people.

I will always try my best to ease the pain for others and will always spread an abundant amount of love, kindness and hope as long as I live."

Bless you, Nicolle, Sophia and all the contributors and volunteers, whose love and dedication have helped in providing a small ray of joy and comfort to many suffering children and teens, while triumphing over your own personal pain and sorrow with God's love and grace.






